WHAT IS A THEME IN WORDPRESS?

- A theme defines the look and feel of the pages and posts in your website.
- It provides locations for a header, menus, widgets, a content area and a footer.
- It provides styling options available through the customizer or theme options settings in the dashboard.
- It may bring in additional plugin like functionality. For example a photography theme may have a photo gallery built in.

WORDPRESS PAGES

- Pages Static part of your website. They may have a hierarchy. Used by to build an SEO friendly slug. Pages may have theme specific templates for different layouts.
- Posts blog section of your website. Posts are organized by categories, and have tags for search engines. Posts can have featured images and these are treated differently depending on the theme.
- Archive pages (blog pages) a WP generated page with several posts. Layout differs greatly based on the theme.

PICKING A THEME CAN BE TRICKY

- ▶ Themes look different from their mock up pages.
- Some features may be only available in the Pro version
- You'll need to add some content before you get a feeling for how the theme will work for your needs
- In particular you need several pages and a half dozen posts plus some header or gallery photos (or drawings) to build a mock up.
- You may need to build some dummy pages for a menu structure
- You'll need to explore theme options.
